UPDATE ON BABY PENDO MURDER CASE

- 1. The DPP would like to inform the general public that four (4) senior police officers were today charged before a Milimani Court with multiple counts of crimes against humanity, including murder, rape, and torture, as follows:
 - i. Inspector John Chengo Masha was charged with the Murder of Baby Samantha Pendo and an alternative charge of failing to refer the matter for investigation and prosecution; Rape, and alternative charge of failing to prevent or suppress widespread acts of sexual violence against civilian women, Torture and failing to submit these matters to competent authorities for investigation and prosecution.
- ii. Inspector Linah Kosgey was charged with the Murder of Baby Samantha Pendo and an alternative charge of failing to refer the matter for investigation and prosecution; Rape, alternative charge of failing to prevent or suppress widespread acts of sexual violence against civilian women; Torture and failing to submit these matters to competent authorities for investigation and prosecution.
- iii. Robi Wankio was charged with Rape, and alternative charge of failing to prevent or suppress widespread acts of sexual violence against civilian women; Torture and failing to submit these matters to competent authorities for investigation and prosecution.

iv. **James Rono** was charged with **Rape**, and alternative charge of failing

to prevent or suppress widespread acts of sexual violence against

civilian women; Torture and failing to submit these matters to

competent authorities for investigation and prosecution.

2. The four (4) pleaded not guilty to one (1) count of Murder, eleven (11)

counts of Rape and Thirty Eight (38) counts of Torture respectively

before Justice Margaret Waringa Muigai. The case will be mentioned on

12th May 2025 for further directions.

3. In addition, following the disappearance Mohamed Baa who remains at

large to date, the **DPP** has since reviewed the charges in order to strengthen

the prosecution case.

4. Consequently, the DPP has directed that the eight (8) officers record

statements as prosecution witnesses.

5. The DPP urges the media outlets to always do fact-checking before

publishing content.

6. The Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP) remains

committed to executing its constitutional mandates in accordance with the

Rule of Law, Public Interest and the administration of justice.
